

# Aims of the project:

→ to include young people from vulnerable groups in Croatia, Romania, and Slovakia to various volunteering activities and thus, integrate them into society,

→ to recognize competencies and skills acquired through volunteering and to increase the employability of young people, and

→ to inform about tools for recognition and validation of skills and competencies gained through volunteering already existing within Europe.

## **Activities:**

→ to train 36 volunteer coordinators in all partner countries who will be then prepared to coordinate young volunteers from vulnerable groups,

→ to develop training materials and tailored training for volunteer managers/ coordinators working with young people from vulnerable groups,

→ to create a website www.civcil.eu providing information about already existing tools for recognition and validation of competences acquired through volunteering in Europe, and

→ to create or to improve the following online tools for recognition and validation of competences gained through volunteering in partner countries:

### Croatia – Certificate on Competencies acquired through volunteering

The process of monitoring competencies gained through volunteering was created as a response to the need to recognize them, to use them for better employability and both personal and professional development. A certificate is a tool for all long-term volunteers, who volunteer regularly and continuously on a weekly basis for at least three months without interruption. A volunteer hosting organization hands the certificate to those long-term volunteers who requested it in advance. The certificate is recognized by Law on Volunteering in Croatia. www.volontiram.info/kompetencije

#### **Romania – Volunteering Certificate**

The online platform supports organizations by providing a way for issuing volunteering certificates. According to the latest Volunteering Law in Romania, if a volunteer requests such a certificate, it is mandatory for a volunteer organization to issue it. The certificates are generated based on a set of information collected by the organizations through a monitoring activity. The aim is to increase the volunteer's chances of entering the labor market. Each certificate is assigned a unique registration number. www.hartavoluntariatului.ro

#### Slovakia – V-Skills for Employment – D-zručnosti pre zamestnanie

The online tool – V-Skills for Employment – is focused on the recognition of skills and competencies gained through volunteering. A volunteer collects the evidence confirming these skills and competencies with the support of a volunteer center or a volunteerinvolving organization. This evidence is consequently certified by a special committee at the Matej Bel University in Banska Bystrica, Slovakia.
